| Competition \& Age Group: | 1. Men master (41-50 yrs. - born between 1973-1982) <br> 2. Men regent ( 51 yrs. \& over - born in 1972 or before) <br> 3. Men ( 60 yrs. \& over - born in 1963 or before) |

| Player eligibility and classification | 1. Teams from Thailand <br> - Players must have Thai nationality <br> - Team can register two (2) players of other nationality, but only one (1) can be on the court at the same time <br> - Players can play for only one (1) team and only one (1) age group <br> 2. Teams from other Asian countries <br> - Players must be of the nationality of the representing country <br> - Players can play for only one (1) team and only one (1) age group <br> 3. All players must have a valid life insurance and medical certificate issued within no more than 7 days before the start of the competition to be presented to the organizing staff <br> 4. Players and teams must present a valid confirmation of receiving at least two (2) COVID-19 vaccination shots <br> 5. Each team must register at least 8 players but not more than 12 players <br> 6. Teams can register no more than 4 staff members including one (1) team manager, one (1) head coach, one (1) assistant coach, and one (1) team officer, including all players to be 16 persons per team |
| Protest: | - A protest shall be done strictly under FIBA Regulations |
| Competition system: | Competition system for $5 \times 5$ <br> 6 teams per age group (should there be applications for more than 6 teams, the organizers reserve the rights to make a final decision) <br> 1. First Round Teams will be placed via a draw in two (2) groups of three (3) teams and will play in a round-robin format within the group as below: <br> 6 teams for men's basketball, round-robin within the group <br> 2. Semi Finals The first and second placed teams in each group advance to the Final Phase, detailed as follows <br> Match 1 First placed team in Group A vs Second placed team in |

Group B
Match 2 First placed team in Group B vs Second placed team in Group A
3. Championship game arranged as follows

Winning teams in Semi Final to play for Championship
Losing teams in Semi Final both get joint third place finish
Remark: Organizers reserves the rights to manage the competition system as seen fit accordingly to the number of teams in participation

## Points and Standing system

1. Winning teams receive 2 points, losing teams receive 1 point, and teams that fail to show up in the agreed time or disqualified by the game officials receive 0 points
2. Tiebreaker for teams with the same amount of points are as follows 2.1 For 2 teams with the same amount of points in the standings, the tiebreaker to consider which team is placed higher is the Head-to-Head results between both teams
2.2 If there are more than two teams in a tiebreaker, refer to FIBA competition regulation

## Code of Conduct

1. Players must be confirmed to have good health with a medical certificate
2. Players must report in person to the organizing committee to confirm identification documents and medical certificate before every game and should there be a request to do so
3. Players are eligible to play only if they are correctly registered as per competition regulations and rostered by the head coach as presented before each game. If found that a player that isn't registered/rostered plays in a game for any team, that team will be forfeited and receive 0 points for that game.
4. Players, coaches, team managers, and team staff must respect and accept the game officials and the decisions made by game officials at all times.

Players, coaches, team managers, and team staff that provoke or instigate others whether by manner, physically or verbally that might result in violence that impedes the progress of the competition will be penalized as per consideration of the organizer. <br> 6. Players, coaches, team managers, and team staff must cooperate with the game officials, organizing staff, table officials, and organizing committee to make sure the competition is organized in orderly fashion. <br> 7. The team caption and head coach are the only representatives of the team that can inquire or request an explanation concerning game officiating from the game officials, but must be done in a polite and mannerly fashion. Inquiries and requests can only be made in dead ball situations and when the game clock has stopped. <br> 8. The competition organizers and/or game officials reserve the rights to not allow any players that have a contagious illness or any illness that could affect the process of the competition to play in a game. Players, coaches, team managers, and team staff must comply with this decision under any circumstances. <br> Roles and responsibilities of team manager, head coach, and team captain <br> 1. Team managers must represent the team in the technical meeting which is held before the event as scheduled and arrange by the organizing committee. <br> 2. In the case the team manager cannot attend the technical meeting, the head coach, assistant coach, or team official must instead be the team representative in this meeting. <br> 3. 40 minutes before game time, the head coach must submit the game roster noting all registered players with their jersey numbers as well as remarking the five starting players in that game. |
